

Life-Giving lent

As soon as we are ushered into a new year with all the good wishes, new resolutions and celebrations; the Church has a special way to help us understand the meaning of our lives in the context of the world and time we live. Lent is the key word to understand the newness and meaning of life.

On February the 21st, Ash Wednesday will be here. But where will we be? What chance has Lent to be in our busy lives, lives with calendars set by our places of work, by sports, by our organizations and our government, by paychecks, by schools whose various winter and spring breaks come regardless of what our parish church is doing or not doing. Aside from Mardi Gras and Carnival, Lent is unknown to most of the society at large.

Lent can not be unknown to us. For it is the spring time of the church. In the early church Lent's 40 days evolved as part of a late winter/early spring cycle whose center became the baptism of adults and children who were ready to embrace life in the body of Christ, the church. Lent was 40 days for the new comers and the veterans to get the habits of life in Christ into our bones and muscles, our words and deeds, our waking and our sleeping. The keeping of Lent was for all the church, for all the baptized people a time to get down to the basics; to repent, reform and renew.

Whatever the century and whatever the year; wherever any community of Christians has made a home, like ours, the announcement of Lent comes with Ash Wednesday as a solemn proclamation that newness of life is offered to every body in Christ Jesus. Ashes are not so much grim as they are true. They are real. They tell an honest story, perhaps more honest than any story about our human life that we are listening to anywhere else. The ashes and the words "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you will return" are nothing if they are not the Gospel summons to enter into Lent as a church.

Let us be clear about a few things that Lent is not. Lent is not a one-day show. Lent is not some sort of churchy self-improvement program that asks just a tiny bit of self-denial and rewards us with lost pounds or saved money.

Lent is not something I do by myself, my own little good resolutions... We are all together in this: "breath-taking experience." No one does it alone. I do not keep Lent. You do not keep Lent. The church keeps Lent. Lent is about the church becoming church. It is the baptized becoming baptized. It is about human beings like ourselves trying to grapple with what the Gospel asks of human beings now, here and everywhere; "the world God so loved"

Ashes are honest, and we are going to wear them to remind each other that they summon us to take Lent seriously. To be trained or retrained to do and be all that we promised and all that we renounced at our baptism. By learning how to pray, by learning to fast in some ways that will tell us what we really hunger for; by learning to give what we call "ours" without counting on anything except the mercy of God; that is what Lent will be for us.

So, let us make a Lent like we have never made a Lent before. We will pray in many ways. We will fast and discover what it is that we should be so hungry and thirsty for: We will begin to let go of our desperate hold on what we call "ours," and start working ourselves out of slavery and into the freedom of God's children. And doing this, we will walk boldly and yet with trepidation toward that font where on that night of the sacred Easter Vigil we will dare to promise and renounce anew. We will dare to baptize those newcomers who want to drown all the works of sin and want to live freely, as servants in Christ our Lord.

St. Joseph's Preservation Task Force

When the St. Joseph's School and Convent were sold in the summer of 2005, a portion of the proceeds were set aside to address structural needs of the St. Joseph's Chapel building. These needs were identified during two inspections conducted in the spring of 2005 by a stone / masonry expert from Oregon State University and a structural engineer. The condition of the Chapel was rated as "good" but repointing of the mortar, repair of the doorway base stone, and reinforcement of the altar wall were items listed as requiring attention. Some electrical work and strengthening of the bell wheels may also be needed.

Father Enrique has now commissioned a task force to address this need. The role of the task force will include: apply for grant money to augment existing funds, prioritize repair work, develop a plan to get the work done, and execute the plan during this spring and summer. IRA Rollover Gifts

A Special Gift Opportunity

On August 17, 2006, the President signed into law the Pension Protection Act of 2006. The Pension Protection Act will allow individuals over age 70½ make tax-free donations of up to \$100,000 from their IRAs directly to a qualified public charity for 2006 and 2007 only.

Individuals who are looking to make charitable contributions may prefer to use IRA money to make their contributions so that normally taxable distributions from their IRAs can be made tax-free. The gift qualifies for the individual's IRA minimum distribution and could substantially lower taxes. This opportunity will only last until December 31, 2007. RCIA Rite of Election

The RCIA Rite of Election will be held on **Friday, February 23 at 7 pm at St. Anthony Church**. This celebration, which coincides with the opening of Lent, marks the beginning of the final period of preparation for the Sacraments of Initiation that will be received at the Easter Vigil.

This step in the Catechumen's formation process is called election because the acceptance made by the Church is founded on the election by God, in whose name the Church acts. It is also called the enrollment of names because as a pledge of fidelity the Catechumens write their names in the Book of the Elect that lists those who have made this journey of faith to the Sacraments of Initiation.

Bishop Michael Driscoll, who is the celebrant for this Rite, will declare in the presence of the community the Church's approval of the Catechumens. From the day of their election and admission, the catechumens are called "the elect."

Catechumens from throughout the Deanery, including several adults and children from our parish, will be participating in this Rite. Everyone in our parish is encouraged to show your support by attending the celebration or by praying for our Elect as they continue on their lifelong journey of faith.

As you can see December was a good month for collections and also expenses. There were no extraordinary costs in any area.

Thanks to both Knights of Columbus Councils for their gifts of \$150.00 each for the flowers used during Christmas. That along with the generous contributions of the parishioners, took care of almost the entire expense.

Statements for the pledges to the Capital Campaign will be sent out by the 10th of every month. Some of you have paid prior to receiving your statement and they crossed in the mail. If you have already made your payment don't worry about the statement.

There are a few people putting their pledge amount on

the same check as their regular contribution. Please write two separate checks, as they are for two separate funds and two separate deposits. Thanks.

As of 1-10-07 we have received \$1,722,732 in pledges from 411 families. We continue to receive new pledges, so if you haven't had a chance to pledge it's not too late.

January is always a busy time for bookkeepers. Without the help of some great volunteers, I would still be stuffing statements!!! Because of their help, year end statements were sent out on January 9th, for both regular contributions and pledge contributions. Sacrament of Confirmation

How to choose a sponsor:

In the meantime, adults and teens are preparing to be confirmed. Each candidate needs a Sponsor for Confirmation, someone who will guide them through their preparation and share the story of faith with them. The best person would be their baptismal sponsor, if it is possible. Having one of their godparents helps us to see how Baptism and Confirmation are connected. But perhaps they live too far away or they are no longer practicing the Catholic faith. Then candidates will need to choose a new sponsor.

A sponsor is someone you trust, whose faith you admire and who will be there for you. *They are to be confirmed Catholics, at least 16 years old and practicing members of the Church, while not being your parents.* This means you can choose a relative, friend or someone from your parish as your sponsor.

Pray about it, and when you think you have the right person, ask him or her to help you grow in faith by being your sponsor.

For Sponsors:

If you have been chosen to be a Confirmation sponsor, congratulations! This person sees you in a profound faith commitment finds trust and knows you are someone who will care about them and their faith. Here are a few suggestions on how to be the best possible sponsor for your candidate.

Be a living model of faith. If the way you practice your faith is not what it should be, "get it together", so to speak. You don't have to become artificially saintly, but your faith should be authentic and sincere.

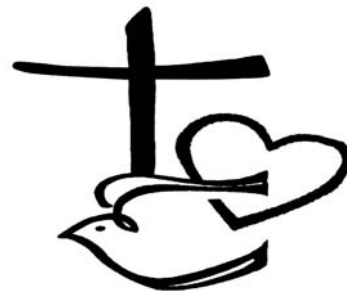
Pray for your candidate and yourself. As candidates decide to be confirmed, they need spiritual strength. Your prayers are important; don't forget to pray for yourself! Attend Mass together, and attend the communal Reconciliation service on March 14.

Give of your time and share your gifts. This may mean helping with service projects or coming to a class. Offer a gift of spiritual significance- a new Bible, rosary or book about our faith or about the saint the candidate has chosen. Be creative and relevant!

Don't miss the ceremony. Your basic job will be to place your hand on your candidate's shoulder, and to provide support. But your role as sponsor is just beginning.

Don't forget special days for your candidate. Remember their birthday, and this anniversary. Send a letter or make a call. Continue to attend Mass together once in a while and do some Christian service together. Share the "Gifts of the Spirit" with each other. (Catholic Update C0497)

Actualidad sobre nueva Parroquia Espiritu Santo Por Brad Bugger

Los líderes de la comunidad parroquial Espiritu Santo han identificado varias áreas en las que será necesario trabajar para poder lograr nuestra meta de comenzar la construcción de la nueva Parroquia en la primavera del año 2008. Las tareas han sido divididas entre varios sub-comités de parroquianos, quienes mantendrán informado al comité central de la nueva Parroquia. “Yo estoy muy agradecido a quienes han ofrecido su tiempo y su talento para asumir esta responsabilidad,” indicó el Padre Enrique Terriquez, Pastor de la Parroquia Espiritu Santo, “Sin su dedicación sería imposible lograr la meta de comenzar a construir a principios del próximo año.”

Entre las tareas primordiales se encuentran:

1. La creación de un plan revisado para la nueva escuela, el cual ha sido asignado al sub-comité de Educación, a cargo de Beth Huston y Meg Downey.
2. La creación de un plan revisado para las facilidades de la Parroquia, el cual ha sido asignado al sub-comité de Adoración, a cargo de Kevin Helgesen.
3. Determinar la cantidad mayor del préstamo que la parroquia puede asumir, el cual ha sido asignado al sub-comité de Finanzas, a cargo de Phil Blick.
4. La creación de un plan para vender los 100 acres de terreno ubicados en Gathe road, para así poder aumentar las ganancias de la Parroquia, esto ha sido asignado al sub-

comité de Terrenos, a cargo de Jane Tweeten.

5. Recomendación sobre el modo a proceder en la venta de la propiedad de San Pablo, asignado igualmente al sub-comité de Terrenos.

“Estos 5 aspectos son cruciales para seguir adelante con el proceso,” indicó Bruce Olenick, miembro del comité central de la nueva Parroquia. “También llevaremos a cabo reuniones con los arquitectos y consultores litúrgicos para determinar como podemos alterar el diseño de la parroquia y otras estructuras, para poder reducir los costos de construcción.” El Padre Enrique, Bruce Olenick, y Kathy Barkdull se reunieron con los oficiales diocesanos en diciembre para discutir que debe hacer la Parroquia Espiritu Santo para poder comenzar la construcción de las nuevas facilidades. La Diócesis reiteró que la Parroquia necesita obtener el 70% del dinero antes de comenzar la construcción, ya sea en dinero efectivo, ofrecimientos de dinero, o propiedades. Actualmente contamos con \$1 millón de dólares en dinero efectivo, y compromisos de pagos de dinero que suman \$1.72 millones de dólares. En adición, la Parroquia tiene propiedades en Gathe road y en San Pablo para la venta, mientras tanto, continuamos recibiendo dinero y donaciones. Es necesario reducir el costo del diseño de la Parroquia, el cual originalmente se estimaba en \$10 millones de dólares, para lograr alcanzar el 70% requerido antes de comenzar la construcción.

El Concilio Pastoral de la Parroquia Espiritu Santo recibió buenas noticias durante la reunión de la junta en enero; Dave Alexander, del concilio 892 de los Caballeros de Colon, hizo una donación de \$100,000 dólares para la construcción de la nueva Parroquia, a cambio de que se garantice espacio en las nuevas facilidades para llevar a cabo las actividades de los Caballeros de Colon. “Estamos muy entusiasmados y agradecidos a los Caballeros de Colon por su contribución,” dijo el Padre Enrique, “Nuestro actual diseño incluye espacio para los caballeros de Colon, quienes realizan una importante labor caritativa en nuestra parroquia.”

**Building Status

Holy Spirit Parish leaders have identified several key tasks that will be necessary to meeting our goal of breaking ground on the new church building and the church-school infrastructure by spring of 2008. These tasks have been parceled out to various sub-committees made up of parishioners, who will report back to the Building Core Committee.

“I’m extremely grateful to the many parishioners who are giving of their time and talents to take on these tasks,” said Father Enrique Terriquez, Holy Spirit Pastor. “Without their dedication, we could not meet the goal of breaking ground by early next year.”

Among the key tasks are:

1. Creating a revised plan for a new school, which has been assigned to the Education Subcommittee, chaired by Beth Huston and Meg Downey.
2. Creating a revised plan for the new church facility, which has been assigned to the Worship Subcommittee, chaired by Kevin Helgesen.
3. Determine the maximum loan amount that the parish can afford, which has been assigned to the Finance Subcommittee, chaired by Phil Blick.
4. Creation of a plan for selling the 100 acres of excess ground currently held in the Gathe Road area in order to maximize parish profit, which has been assigned to the Site Subcommittee, chaired by Jane Tweeten.
5. A recommendation of how to proceed with the appraisal and sale of the St. Paul’s property, which also has been assigned to the Site Subcommittee.

“Those five items are critical to moving forward with the new building process,” said Bruce Olenick, co-chair of the Building Core Committee. “In addition, there will be meetings with the architects and the liturgical consultant to determine how we can alter the design of the church and other facilities in order to reduce costs.”

Bruce Olenick, Father Enrique and Pastoral Associate Kathy Barkdull met with Diocesan officials in December to clarify what Holy Spirit needed to do in order to be able to break ground on the new church and school. The Diocese reiterated that the parish needed to have 70 percent of the cost of the new church in hand in the form of cash, pledges and/or property prior to beginning construction of the first phase. The current building fund has just over \$1 million in cash, with pledges totaling \$1.77 million. In addition, the parish has the Gathe Road and St. Paul’s property available to sell, and new pledges and donations continue to come in on a regular basis. Reducing the cost of the church design, originally estimated at about \$10 million, is another necessity in order to meet the 70 percent funding requirement to begin construction.

The Holy Spirit Pastoral Council got some good news during its January board meeting when Dave Alexander of the Knights of Columbus Council 892 announced the Columbus Home Association was prepared to donate \$100,000 to the building fund, in return for assurances of space for Knights activities in the new complex.

“We’re very excited and grateful to the Knights for their contribution to the building efforts,” said Father Enrique. “Our current designs include dedicated space for the Knights of Columbus, who perform very important charitable work for our parish.”
