



## “Rejoice, Jesus Christ our King, is risen.”

The 40 days of Lent have prepared us with our various attempts to remake our church and ourselves: praying, fasting and giving alms of time and money and whatever else we found possible. Lent work was to bring us back to the life we entered and promised at baptism. And if we let Lent do its job; we are now ready to enter the Holy Week at the beginning of April, and then to live out into the Easter Season what we proclaim on Easter Sunday. The 50 days from Easter to Pentecost are always like a rehearsal of God’s time, God’s reign, “thy kingdom come!” What we promise to do at the baptismal font will make us bold enough to proclaim in joyful hope what we believe.

If Easter is at the epicenter of our faith: our lives are like a series of circles, coming and going from that center. At the heart of the Easter celebration is the Vigil. Surrounding that center; flowing to and from that center: are the three days that we call the *Paschal Triduum*, the Easter three days. They embrace the Vigil night, and when that ends we are on Easter.

So, how do we enter into the Paschal Triduum? There is a gate we will have to pass through on Holy Thursday. We will stand before it. It is the deed we are invited to do, the washing of the feet. Something so simple, something so outstanding! In the Gospel we read that night; John does not tell us about the bread and wine at the last supper; but about what Jesus did and told his followers to do. And once a year, as a way to take ourselves into the Paschal mystery, we do what Jesus asked.

It is a wonderful deed. We have to look at its simplicity. There are some willing to bare their feet. Someone is willing to take a basin of water and some soap and wash the feet of another person. To take in one’s hands the feet of another person, to give your feet into the hands of another: What does it mean? What does it mean to wash gently and with no hurry, to dry the feet of a friend or a stranger? Who can say what it means? That is why we do it. We do it to find out what we mean, what being a Christian means, what being baptized into the death and life of Jesus means.

The washing of one another’s feet is a vision of how people might live together. Who can do that? None of us alone, that we know. But we are church and we the church are forever trying to love the world the way God loves it, the way Jesus loved the world on that night before he died. “I give you a new commandment” Jesus said, “love one another as I have loved you.” And lest we misunderstand and make that into something pretty and vague, Jesus showed us what this love looks like: Good Friday leaves no doubt: “and from his side blood and water flowed out.”

When we will end our prayer together on Good Friday, remembering how Christ died for us, we will go quietly. We will have another day to be fasting, so that we can be filled with anticipation of what we dare to celebrate on Saturday night when we keep the Vigil. The church hungers and thirsts for the one a year deeds we celebrate on the Vigil. The church hungers and thirsts to light that fire, to spend precious time with words of scripture texts that we hold dear; and most of all we hunger and thirst to go with the elect, the catechumens, to the waters of baptism and there to embrace them and let them lead us to the table.

The powerful exclamation on the Vigil “*Rejoice*” that follows the entrance of the Easter candle into the church and the sanctuary, and when all the lights come on; the Easter Proclamation sets the tone not only for the Vigil but for the entire Easter Season: “*Rejoice, Heavenly powers! ... Jesus Christ our King is risen! Sound the trumpet of salvation! ... Rejoice, o earth! ... Christ has conquered! Glory fills you! Darkness vanishes forever! ... Rejoice, O Mother Church! ... Exult in glory! Let this place resound with joy, echoing the mighty song of all God’s people!*”

Hope the echo of this mighty song will resound in our daily lives.

Total gross income at this time is \$7,337.50 with only about \$500.00 in bills. (I'm not sure if I have received all of the invoices).

The income from the Food Fair made it possible to pay the remaining \$3,000.00 on the Idaho Catholic Register bill, and also put \$3,000.00 into the Parish Savings account. There is also a new microwave in the St Anthony kitchen. Thanks again to everyone.

**The Knights of Columbus Council 892 have pledged \$100,000.00 to the New Building Fund.** This is a tremendous help toward our goal. **THANKS.** If you have not yet

made a pledged please consider giving a donation to help build our Catholic Community's future in the Pocatello/Chubbuck area.

As of 03-08-07 we have received \$1,837,296.00 in pledges from 431 families.

**The Idaho Catholic Appeal** started on March 4<sup>th</sup>. The goal this year is \$101,665.00. All money received goes directly to the Diocese. ## Keeping You Informed

In an ongoing effort to keep you informed about the building campaign, the Parish Council and Core Committee are responding to questions and comments we receive from parishioners. Following are questions we have received, and our answers:

**1. I continue to be concerned about the ability to maintain new mortgage payments plus the usual and unusual regular monthly running of the parish. Note: many months collections do not cover our existing expenses and we did not meet our DDP last year?**

**Answer:** It is a legitimate concern. Holy Spirit has very little flexibility in its budget, and we all know that maintenance issues crop up when you least expect them. As you know, Holy Spirit must have in hand prior to beginning construction on the new facilities at least 70 percent of the estimated cost of the facilities in cash, pledges or property. We likely will have to borrow from the Diocese in order to fund construction, but we are looking very carefully at how much we will be able to afford to borrow and how much our payments will be. We are hopeful that our current assets – the excess property on Gathe Road and the St. Anthony's and St. Paul's property – will yield a good return that will greatly reduce the amount of money we will have to borrow. We are also hopeful that pledges and contributions will continue to come into the building campaign.

The bottom line is there is no easy way to raise the money we will need to build a new church and school, but we are working hard at addressing those things we can influence: cost of the new buildings and the value of existing properties.

**2. What impact are you anticipating with the announcement of the Hoku Industrial Plant being built so close to the site of our proposed campus?**

**Answer:** That is a question that our council and committee members have been asking since the Hoku announcement. We are working with the Diocese and the City of Pocatello to determine what impacts it may have as far as reducing Holy Spirit's costs to achieve annexation of our property into the city, and to provide infrastructure (roads, sewer and water) to our site. If we can work together with the city, Hoku and potential developers, it is possible that our costs could be reduced. We are also hopeful that the Hoku announcement will positively impact the value of the excess property on Gathe Road. None of this is definite at this point, but the Hoku announcement may well be a positive development for our building efforts.

**3. We were told that only 50 acres of land were needed for the new church and school, but the parish has purchased 181 acres. Why?**

**Answer:** The Parish Council and Core Committee believe the land that was offered near Gathe Road was available at a very reasonable price, with a good chance that it will increase in value. While it is true that we only need about 50 acres for the church and school, but the hope is to retain at least 80 acres to provide room for any future expansion. The additional land will serve as an investment. We are working to determine the best way to increase the value of that excess property, through annexation into the city, and the addition of infrastructure, such as roads, water and sewer. The recent announcement that Hoku is looking to build its new plant in the area may also help us in that we may be able to team with the company and other potential developers to share the infrastructure costs.

Thank you once again for your comments and questions, and for your ongoing support. Please keep praying for the building efforts, and keep your questions and comments coming.



## Befriender Ministry By Cristina Serpa

The Holy Spirit Catholic Community in Pocatello has begun an outreach process which we have chosen to call “The Befriender Ministry”. Many of our parishioners have expressed that they know very few friends in the church community or may not feel welcome and included. Often, they just need someone to reach out in a more welcoming fashion.

Families with few connections to others in the parish community may have needs of which no one is aware. Someone may have short-term needs, such as a ride to a doctor’s appointment, help with shopping for groceries, someone to visit or with whom to pray, etc. Elderly members, homebound, new mothers, grieving members, newly married couples, single parents, and a variety of people in various circumstances may simply need a caring person to send a card, make a phone call, take in a meal, or spend a few minutes listening with compassion.

A lady in Idaho Falls called the parish office, concerned about a friend in Pocatello who had recently had a new baby. This new mother also has three children under the age of six and is not a member of our parish. One of our group was notified, and we visited her to learn in what manner we might assist her. She was very grateful.

Another elderly couple in our parish have no transportation and need help shopping for their groceries every Friday after they get paid. We have organized some assistance for them.

Our mission is to attend to peoples’ physical, emotional and spiritual needs; connecting resources to people in need. We have often missed the opportunity to do our Lord’s work because we were unaware of the need. We encourage anyone who knows of a need to call the parish office, as communication is a key component. We invite more to join us in this ministry, and we look forward to helping fellow parishioners we know and those we have yet to meet. Our ultimate vision is to create a sense of welcome, belonging, compassion and community.
